Applications Sought for Attorney Seats on Supreme Court's Disciplinary Commission

The Disciplinary Commission of the Arizona Supreme Court is accepting applications to fill two attorney member vacancies. The Commission meets monthly to review recommendations of attorney discipline made by hearing officers regarding attorneys who are charged with professional misconduct. The Commission can recommend such disciplinary action as disbarment, suspension, or censure of attorneys. It can also order informal reprimands or dismiss charges. All Commission recommendations are subject to final review by the Arizona Supreme Court.

Six attorneys and three public members comprise the commission, and each member may serve up to two three-year terms. Applicants for the vacant lawyer positions must be attorneys who are active members of the State Bar of Arizona.

“The Disciplinary Commission provides the important service of protecting the public against attorneys who may have acted unethically,” said Chief Justice Ruth V. McGregor. “By involving attorney members, the Commission raises the caliber of Arizona’s attorneys, moving the entire judicial branch from good to great.”

The Disciplinary Commission will review applications and recommend candidates to the Arizona Supreme Court. The deadline for submitting applications is **Friday, August 24, 2007**. Applications may be obtained from:
