**Applications Being Accepted
For Vacancy on Maricopa County Superior Court**

Applications are being accepted for a vacancy on the Maricopa County Superior Court created by the retirement of Judge Gregory Martin, effective November 30, 2007.

The Maricopa County Commission on Trial Court Appointments will review applications, interview selected applicants and recommend at least three nominees to Governor Janet Napolitano, who will appoint the new judge.

Applicants must be at least 30 years old, admitted to practice law in and a resident of Arizona for the past five years, and a resident of Maricopa County for the past year.

The original completed application and 17 copies must be returned to the Administrative Office of the Courts, Human Resources Division, 1501 W. Washington, Suite 221, Phoenix, AZ, 85007, by 3:00 p.m. on Friday, November 30, 2007. Applicants for the recent vacancy in Maricopa County will be considered for the new vacancy and do not need to re-apply. The Commission may, at its discretion, use the applications filed for this vacancy to nominate candidates for any additional vacancies known to the Commission before the screening meeting for this vacancy is held.

All meetings of the Maricopa County Commission on Trial Court Appointments are open to the public. Meeting dates will be announced next month. The new judge will be paid \$135,844 annually.
