On October 4, 1996, by Administrative Order No. 96-49, the Court adopted Human Resources Policies for Supreme Court Employees which replaced all previous and existing human resources policies.

On December 4, 1997, the Court adopted a revision to those policies allowing the transfer of sick leave by employees transferring from other state agencies.

It is now the desire of the Court to make the Leave Policy and Education Assistance Policy more competitive and to create "on-call" pay for information technology staff who maintain critical business systems which operate on a twenty-four hour, seven day a week schedule.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Article VI, Sections 3 and 7 of the Arizona Constitution,

IT IS ORDERED that the attached amendments to Sections 6.07, "Work Hours and Reporting Requirements Policy," 6.10 "Leave Policy," and 6.18, "Education Assistance Policy" of the Human Resources Policies for Supreme Court Employees, adopted by Administrative Order No. 96-49 on October 4, 1996, and 97-66 adopted on December 4, 1997, are adopted effective July 1, 2000.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the attached amendments to Sections 6.07, "Work Hours and Reporting Requirements Policy," 6.10, "Leave Policy," and 6.18, "Education Assistance Policy," hereby revises the previous and existing Human Resources policy sections, and this amendment be considered the governing authority.
