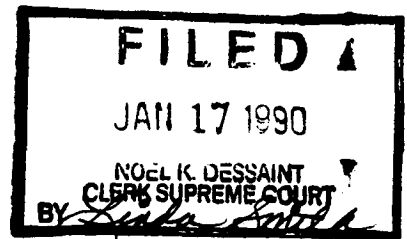


SUPREME COURT OF ARIZONA



ADMINISTRATIVE SUPERVISION OF MUNICIPAL COURTS

Administrative Order No. 90-3

In order to promote more efficient administration in and of the Municipal Courts in each of the Counties of this State and, pursuant to Article 6, Sections 3 and 11, Constitution of Arizona, as amended,

IT IS ORDERED that the administrative supervision over the Municipal Courts in the respective Counties by the Supreme Court, as exercised through the Chief Justice, is hereby delegated to the Presiding Judges of the Superior Court in the respective Counties in which each has been appointed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Presiding Superior Court Judge shall, but not be limited to:

1. Meeting on a regular basis with the Presiding Judges in the Municipal Courts to discuss legal, administrative, separation of powers, resources and other relevant issues to insure proper functioning and independence of the Municipal Courts.
2. Offering such further assistance and advice to the Municipal Courts as the Presiding Judge deems necessary and appropriate.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that such administrative authority as it relates and is applicable to Municipal Courts shall include, but is not limited to, the powers and authority set forth in Rule I, Rules of Practice of the Superior Court of Arizona.
