The Supreme Court, having administrative supervision over all courts of the state pursuant to the Constitution of Arizona, Article VI, periodically conducts reviews and audits of operations.

Pursuant to the foregoing authority the Supreme Court has been advised that the lack of available space at the Kayenta Justice Court facility is impeding the ability of staff from the Administrative Office of the Courts to conduct an operational review. Additionally, the activities associated with the operational review have been disruptive for staff and daily court operations. In order to assure a thorough and proper operational review and avoid disruptions to the Kayenta Justice Court, the temporary removal of court records, including administrative, financial, and case records, is necessary. Therefore,

IT IS NOW ORDERED as follows:

Until further order of the Court, all books and records of the Kayenta Justice Court are placed in the constructive possession of the Administrative Director of the Courts or his designee.

Although constructive possession of the books and records of the Kayenta Justice Court is being hereby transferred to the Administrative Director of the Courts, the Court recognizes that active case and financial records must be available during working hours at the Kayenta Justice Court. Until further notice, staff from the Administrative Office of the Courts will make all active case and financial records available for court operations from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. each weekday. All administrative records not necessary for daily operations and closed case records will remain in the possession of the Administrative Director of the Courts or his designee.
